George M. Cabaniss Jr. is the Deputy to the Commanding General for the U.S. Army Mission and Installation Contracting Command responsible for leading its people and managing its resources. The MICC, a subordinate command to the U.S. Army Contracting Command, provides Army commands, installations and activities with responsive contracting solutions and oversight with about 1,600 people assigned to three brigades, one field directorate office and 33 field-level contracting offices located throughout the nation and Puerto Rico.

The MICC provides supported activities with a variety of contracting support to include Soldier recruitment and training, troop deployments, family and Soldier well-being, weapon system sustainment, base operations, and installation and infrastructure readiness.

Prior to joining the MICC headquarters staff, Mr. Cabaniss served as Chief of the Contracting Office at U.S. Army Contracting Command-Aberdeen Proving Ground, Md., from April 2008 to December 2011. He was appointed to the Senior Executive Service in December 2011.

Mr. Cabaniss possesses a diverse background of federal and private sector experience that includes leadership positions with the Army and Navy as well as the General Services Administration. He is a member of the Army Acquisition Corps and is Defense Acquisition Workforce Improvement Act Level III certified. His previous acquisition assignments include procuring contracting officer for the Naval Aviation Systems Command in Orlando, Fla., from April 2000 to October 2004; chief of the contracting division for Region 10, Federal Technology Service, General Services Administration in Auburn, Wash., from October 2004 to April 2006; and deputy director of contracts for the Superintendent of Shipbuilding Gulf Coast at Pascagoula, Miss., from April 2006 to April 2008.

In addition to his federal service, Mr. Cabaniss was a trial lawyer in Atlanta for approximately 10 years. He is also licensed to practice law in the state of Florida.

Mr. Cabaniss holds a Juris Doctor from Florida State University College of Law, Tallahassee, Fla., a Masters in Public Administration from Golden Gate University in Tampa, Fla., and a Bachelor of Arts from Ambassador College in Pasadena, Calif.
